Abstract and full paper track submissions open: **16 January 2025** Abstracts for full paper submission track deadline: **24 February 2025** Full paper deadline: **9 June 2025** Final camera-ready papers deadline: **11 August 2025** Submission for presentation-only track deadline: **04 August 2025**

Accepted abstracts from both tracks will involve either a presentation with a panel discussion session, or authors can also select to only participate in the highly interactive poster session. Papers presented in the discussion session or at the poster session will be eligible to be published in the Conference Proceedings, with the best papers being selected for the special edition of SAJIE.

Abstracts should be no more than 150 words and should provide an overview of the full paper that will be submitted.
